As explained during the Mediation meeting with Miss Buchanan and Mrs Stallworthy, anything discussed in a Mediation session is strictly confidential and not to be disclosed at any other time. It is therefore not possible to provide you with a written statement regarding any subject that was discussed.

The Avondale Police was contacted as per agreement and we have no record of any complaints received from the date of Mediation.

It is unfortunate that the offer of alternative accommodation at 43 Seaview Terrace, Mt Albert was considered to be unsuitable by your mother as it was in a nice and quiet neighbourhood and considered to be a good offer.

The transfer application will be considered in fair relation to other applicants as and when other suitable properties do become available and your mother will be contacted should a further offer be possible.

I have received a letter dated 5th February 1992 from one of your colleagues who knows absolutely nothing about the matters. I have put to you in my letters.

She refers me back to you for proper explanation.

I would now expect that you have the integrity to answer my questions directly as I put them to you again.

You would refuse to give me information in your knowledge to convict your tenant of theft and wilful destruction of my \$250 prescription glasses on the feeble grounds of confidentiality. You would then disclose information from the same meeting to residents at Moa Rd that my mother had submitted an application for a transfer.

You still have not told me who in your department released this information which you state is 'confidential'. The only people at that meeting were you and Mrs Stallworthy. Please explain that one?

The tenant who abused and spat over my mother on 30th October 1991 (Police Complaint No 911031/5484 recorded as common Assault) is the same person that rushed down the road and in the company of three other vicious types, pulled my car door open and assaulted my mother and I. This incident was summarised to the Police in a letter.

Statement to the Police 18th November 1991.)

These same vicious people had persecuted my mother for month after month and you MS Buchanan did absolutely nothing.

How long are you going to protect people like this who have threatened the lives of myself and my mother?

What action are you currently taking to subdue Ms Kaka, who as recently as today, continues to disrupt my mother's lifestyle with excessive use of the radio/stereo day in and day out.

Mrs Annamika Doherty representing noise Control who called today to the disturbance would also like to know what you are doing to control your tenant?

Would you please advise immediately. I demand honesty from you in this matter, you were made totally aware of all the information I disclose in this letter and expect you to be truthful, even though I observe it is not one of your strong points.

What ever you are telling people you are stopping the truth from being revealed about what is really going on.

If you value your position with the Housing Corp, I caution you to tell the truth, dont make me report you to Head Office in Wellington

For you to threaten to evict my mother in a fraudulent letter I would certainly cover up your position not to have taken proper action.

To put that letter on my mothers file and not tell her is absolutely contemptible.

you won't always be able to get away with what you have put us through and I have some small consolation that you must be doing it to others too. (eg Mrs Girvin, the woman who had her home fire bombed) (Her neighbour tells me the Corpn won't let her back in her home).

I don't know what sort of organisation you are running but can understand when they have people like you, Ms Hill, and Ms McCabe in charge.

Get one thing clear in your office, My mother has every right to campaign for peace and quiet, and you will not continue to try and intimidate her.

1. I have attached a copy of all documentation written by the local Community Constable in respect of Mrs LYMBURN. It will be noted that references to her son appear in some of the documents.
2. Constable MATHIESON has made a brief comment about the mental stability of Anthony Paul LYMBURN.

I have never met either Mrs LYMBURN or Anthony but I have had both telephone and letter dealings with Mrs LYMBURN. I have also had discussions with the Housing Corporation who agreed to relocate Mrs LYMBURN because of difficulties that she was experiencing in the neighbourhood. In the end, she declined to accept the alternative accommodation and remains at Moa Road.

3. There has also been contact between the Police and Mental Health Services reference Mrs LYMBURN. I was advised that Mrs LYMBURN is not certifiable but that she does have a known mental problem.

Since I last spoke to you I have reviewed the file held at Police Headquarters concerning your mother's complaint. I have also received copies of all correspondence, statements and job sheets held by the Police at Avondale.

The position is clear. Your mother for some time has had a running dispute with neighbours. Both sides make allegations against the other. Police have responded to all complaints and spent a considerable amount of time trying to assist your mother and conciliate.

Chief Inspector Fibbes attended at your mother's property to try and assist her but was ordered off. He also arranged alternative accommodation through the Housing Corporation but your mother declined this assistance.

I am satisfied that the Police have at all times acted properly and that there are no grounds for complaint. I cannot advise the Authority to take any action and I see little purpose in further correspondence.

We act for Mrs C Lymburn. She wishes to make a complaint about Police treatment of her over several years, but particularly her contact with Constable Mathieson of the Ponsonby Police Station. Please treat this letter as a formal complaint.

Mrs Lymburn states she has been subjected to a number of attacks from neighbouring residents in her street. We refer to a copy of our client's letter enclosed dated 18 November 1991. Mrs Lymburn believes Constable Mathieson was either unwilling or afraid to follow up those complaints when incidents of abuse and assault occurred against Mrs Lymburn as outlined in her letter of November.

Mrs Lymburn is also concerned at the manner in which her complaints have been treated and the inconsistencies which have occurred as a result. We refer you to M A Fife, Area Controller, Avondale. His letter of 4 July states at the last paragraph, Constable Mathieson at no time discussed Mrs Lymburn with the Ponsonby Care Centre. Yet on 13 February Mrs Lymburn received a letter from the Ponsonby Community Mental Health Centre stating at the second paragraph that Constable Mathieson did in fact discuss her with the staff at the Centre. Copies of those letters are enclosed.

Our client is of the view she is not receiving the protection from the Police she is entitled to and the Police do not take her formal complaints seriously. As a result of this, a great deal of stress has been caused to our client and her son. Mrs Lymburn is of the view that only a formal enquiry pursuant to the Police Complaints Authority can resolve the problems she has experienced in dealing with the Police and specifically, Constable Mathieson of the Ponsonby Police Station.

If Mrs Lymburn is allowed to continue this behaviour we will be unable to rent the unit.

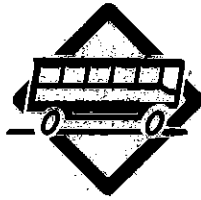

- ◆ requests for sexual favours implying promises of favourable treatment or threats of unfavourable treatment.

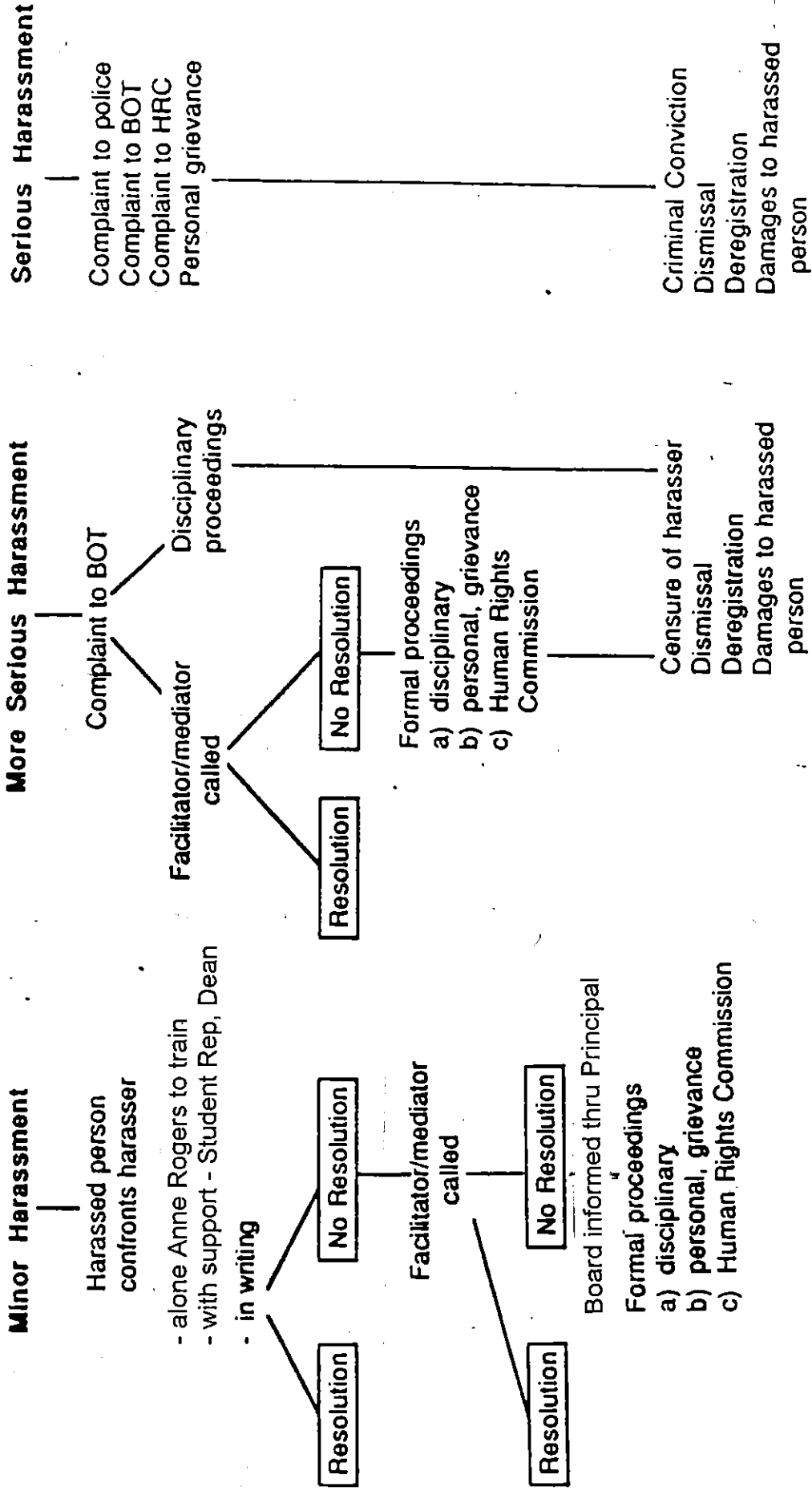
Sexual harassment can occur between:

Dear Mr. Fibbes,

With reference to your letter of 23rd August, 1991, I wish to challenge various points you are making.

You allege that you sent me a letter dated 4th July, 1991. I have received no such letter. Perhaps you would like to forward me a photocopy, as I doubt a reply was even prepared or sent.

After I had sent yet another reminder to Ponsonby Station about my original letter, dated 24th March, 1991, I received a phone call from Sgt Morris who said they had never received any such letter.

I had anticipated this type of response, so I had all my letters registered. New Zealand Post conducted an investigation and told me that Sgt Ross Palmer had signed for registered article 433. I phoned Sgt Morris with this information and he offered the excuse it had been 'misfiled'. I was told by him he would look into it. I indicated that I was not prepared to drop the matter and required a reply in writing.

Many weeks went by and I had still not had any reply to my first letter.

On July 19th, I sent yet another letter to bring the matter to the attention of Sgt Morris and still he ignored me.

To recall your visit to my home:

In the morning, as I was preparing to go out, I received a phone call. No one spoke when I answered. I concluded that someone was establishing whether I was home or not.

A short time later, you were knocking on my door. I had just taken a bath and as I explained to you through the window, I was not fully dressed and that I still preferred a written reply to my letter and would not settle for anything less. (Not the usual Police procedure of avoiding the issue by briefly discussing it and then refusing to do any more). As far as being 'ordered' from the property, you have an unusual interpretation of being declined an interview. I never 'ordered' you anywhere, just simply refused to open my door as I was in my dressing gown and as I told Sgt Morris twice before, wanted the matter settled in writing.

Our interview with Constable Mathieson deteriorated because he again refused to take any action against the ones who were threatening me.

My son did not ask him if he thought I was unstable.

I personally challenged him on this point because he had made insinuations against my mentality on a previous occasion and I believed him to be freely voicing his opinion to others. He admits in writing he holds this view of me.

I therefore challenge him now to prove it.

I reacted to him by stating I considered him to be a coward and I believed it was easier for him to call me unstable than to face the vicious gang that was tormenting me and threatening my life.

I had on a previous phone conversation to the Central Station been told by a constable that Mathieson must have been 'frightened' to deal with these people and I was merely endorsing his observation. The specific household I was complaining about was defended by Mathieson as 'a nice family'. This 'nice family' on December 5th, 1990 accused my son and me of being sexually involved and that both of us had the aids infection.

On 30th October, 1991, the woman from this house blocked my way on the street, criticising me, abusing me and threatening me, and she spat over me saying, "I hope you catch aids" and "I wish you would die, you fucking old bitch".

She used filth and vicious abuse at me all the way down the street to my gate. She said that she could do anything she liked "because the police said you are mental". Phillip from the Ponsonby Care Centre accused Constable Mathieson of trying to procure the appointment for me to see a psychiatrist whether he denies it or not. Mathieson instructed him to call on me. This is now proved. I do not wish to meet with you and a reconciliation with Mathieson is out of the question. Mathieson is responsible for the trouble I am suffering along with my family.

I have very strong reasons to believe he was instrumental in my being insulted and banned from 3 Guys Supermarket, Point Chevalier. He knows Mr. Kerr, the manager, and when I was complaining about the rude way I was being treated by the staff, Kerr ordered me from the store saying, "We are sick of you", "We are going to get rid of you", "You have been in Carrington", "If you come in here again, I will throw you out", "The Police won't take any notice of you".

He was right. When I rang for help from the Citizens Advice Office, the police refused to come down straight away. They arrived hours later.

My son interviewed Sgt Burgoyne and she told him the staff in the store had said to her, "The woman couldn't have come from Carrington, she was too well dressed." Kerr had told them I was from Carrington. Kerr taunted me in the store by saying, "You've got nothing", and "Why don't you live it up". Why would a supermarket manager make such a personal attack on a customer when she wanted a receipt for goods purchased before leaving the store?

On Tuesday 5th November, 1991, my son arrived to take me shopping and to attend the dentist.

He walked up the street to observe a car parked in the drive of the woman who spat over me, three houses up the street. He intended to check for the name of the owner, as we still don't know who she is.

My son was abused as he walked up the street by Mr. Stevens from his kitchen window, straight across the road. Then two women ran out of the house further up and screamed and yelled in a frenzy, "Why are you taking the number"? We endeavoured to get in the car and drive away, but they ran down the road and pulled the driver's door open, and continued to threaten my son. He stood up and grabbed the car lock bar for protection.

I moved around the car to be in support of my son and as I walked around this woman attempted to push me over. My son intervened and pushed her away and she fell on the ground. Then the Maori woman attacked him and two more came running from the opposite house, and they bashed and punched my son to the ground. He swung the bar around to protect himself. I was nearly knocked over in the skirmish and ran in to phone the police. They left it 5 minutes and rang back from the Ponsonby Police Station to ask if they had any 'knives or guns', treating it like a real joke. They did not arrive for at least half an hour. They would not take a record of the event.

My son's glasses were taken by the Maori who spat on me and the police called my son a liar. This Constable Mitchell said he was issuing my son with an official warning. My son asked for it in writing and he refused.

Wednesday 6th November, I was disturbed with knocking on my door. I refused to open it to someone saying they were the Police and they wanted to talk about my son. It was the one who said we had aids and he screamed at me "You slut", "You prostitute", "You whore", and "Last night five men came around here and raped you". He was crazed and smashed my plants. The Maori woman held the glasses up to me at my window and said, "Come out and get them or I'll smash them". I refused. She smashed them out at my gate, I found a piece of the lens. My son said it was from his glasses.

Detective Inspector Davies promised us on November 5th, 1991 to look into the matter. He says now he has given it to Ponsonby. Ponsonby Station told my son he was a liar and told him to 'get going'. They would not give him a complaint form for insurance purposes when he called on 6th November, 1991. How long are they going to try and pretend all this is not happening?

Ponsonby Police may laugh and think it is a big joke. Not one person of the dozens of intelligent people we have interviewed, professional people included, think it is a joke.

It is your responsibility to do something and take action against these people.

Please advise urgently.

Enquiries into the matters raised in your letter of 24.3.91 have been completed. I can now reply to the matters which you raised.


Present at this meeting were you, your son, Constable MATHIESON and a civilian office attendant.

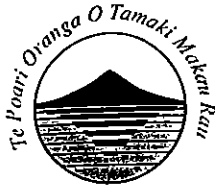

On 24th March 1991 I wrote a letter of complaint to the Senior Sargent of the Ponsoby Police about the conduct of Constable Mathieson. He was labelling me in the Pt Chevalier district as unstable and in need of Psychiatric help.

In my letter, I drew to the Sargent's attention seven of the more serious threats against me. All of these have been laid as official complaints to the Police and all have been waived as not serious enough.

I discovered accidentally in a chance phone call to the Ponsoby Care Centre just exactly what had been going on behind my back. Constable Mathieson arranging with a member of the Centre to have me examined by a Psychiatrist.

I challenged Mathieson's Superior and awaited a reply.

I heard nothing so six weeks later I wrote again

(Letter enclosed.)

I heard nothing so eight weeks later I wrote again

(Letter enclosed)

During this time I was still being harassed in the district and as Constable Mathieson refused to offer me any protection (meeting with him on 4th Dec 1990) I was forced to resort to other avenues for help. The race relations Mediator referred me back to Constable Mathieson for protection.

Letters enclosed.

Some time later a Police Officer arrived at my door. I refused to discuss the matter verbally and did not order him anywhere.

As far as I was concerned Constable Mathieson had been "caught out" and Mr Fibbes came ~~around~~ running around, not because he was concerned for my welfare (all my complaints had been ignored) he was trying to protect ~~the~~ Constable Mathieson and did not want to condemn him on paper.

Letter enclosed.

He informs me now that he wrote to me on 4th July 91. I did not receive this letter from him until it was sent to me along with his letter of 23rd August 1991.

He states in this letter, of the 4th.

"At no time has Constable Mathieson discussed you with Ponsonby Care Centre."

This statement ~~is~~ is totally untrue and he well knows it.

My letter from the Auckland Area Health Board contradicts this plainly.

Mathieson contacted them well into 1990 when they called to my home

Mathieson brought this organisation into the picture. This was one of the reasons why I phoned them on 20th March 1991.

His denial of 4th July 1991 ~~is~~ is totally untrue.

The Auckland Area Health Board will confirm Mathieson involved them prior to 4th July.

They offered me an official apology for a member of their staff assisting Mathieson in ~~the~~ trying to procure an appointment. When they found out what Mathieson was insinuating they were shocked. See Letter of apology.

The Ponsorby Centre's Staff Pip and Lindsay became my only protection after the assault on 5th Nov 1991 and they were on 24 hour call to me should I have needed them. I was afraid because my life had again been threatened and in evidence of what had taken place I did not feel the Police would protect me.

Mr Fibbes states in his letter of 22nd November 1991.

"The specific matters that you raise in the latter part of your letter appear to be the subject of active investigation files."

I have never been advised on their outcome.

If they had actively been investigated Mr Fibbes would now know that I had laid two previous complaints against someone whom I believe I have identified as Gary Russell Chatterton. The same person who threatened my life and the life of my son on 6th November 1991 (See ~~the~~ Letter and conviction notices).

~~I understand he~~

The Court office tells me he is awaiting trial on 24th April 1992 and a private ~~Det~~ Detective advises me it is a charge for very serious assault.

I appeal to you to investigate my claims and I would prefer to defend myself in person.

The Police are covering up their negligent handling of my affairs and I am having things said about me that are not true

My Son and I have Suffered greatly over this situation

My health and my Sons health have deteriorated and my Son has Suffered permanent damage to his arm in the assault.

I have been persecuted for over 10 years living at this address. The Police have actually escalated the situation and destroyed my good name in the district. They have allowed me to be terrorised by criminals

I anxiously await your reply and trust you will grant me the chance to present my case.

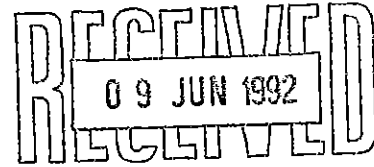

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of 2 June.

My office wrote to Mr A P Lymburn, your client's son, on 26 March, a copy of which is enclosed. That letter briefly, but succinctly, sets out the efforts which Chief Inspector Fibbes has made in an effort to resolve the issues that are worrying Mrs Lymburn. It is clear that every effort has been made to resolve the matters which have been raised by Mrs Lymburn, but to no avail. When the Chief Inspector is ordered off her property when trying to effect a resolution of her concerns it is very difficult to know what other suggestions can be made. Further, if alternative accommodation is arranged because Mrs Lymburn is not happy with where she is living but then this is also refused, once again one is left with the problem of what possible further alternatives can be suggested.

You have taken issue with the fact that apparently Mr Fibbes has made reference to the Community Care Centre in his letter of 4 July and suggest that Constable Mathieson is misleading your client and that likewise Chief Inspector Fibbes is also. However, a cursory perusal of the two enclosures which you have attached would not support the allegation which you have made.


You refer to Chief Inspector Fibbes' letter dated 4 July 1991. In that he stated that:

"At no time has Constable Mathieson discussed you with Ponsonby Care Centre."

That clearly was a statement of the position as at 4 July 1991, as I am sure you would accept. By letter dated 13 February 1992, some 7 months later, the Health Centre says Constable Mathieson has discussed Mrs Lymburn's condition with the Centre. The date of that letter appears to have escaped your notice and its significance.

Senior Constable Mathieson is a Community Constable. Mrs Annette Shea, who wrote to Mrs Lymburn on 13 February 1992, is the Manager of the Health Centre. Mrs Shea has explained that her organisation and her staff are able to provide support for people confronted with the problems confronting your client. Sadly, it does appear as though Mrs Lymburn rejects the offer of support from the Health Centre; she refuses to accept the assistance offered by Chief Inspector Fibbes; and she has rejected outright the offer of the Housing Corporation to arrange alternative accommodation. It appears to me from the papers I have perused that Mrs Lymburn does not wish to be assisted.



I phoned you today to appeal to you, to take some control of a situation which is causing my mother and I a great deal of distress. You totally refused to even listen to me and dismissed me by hanging up the phone on me. In the brief conversation you made reference to my mother Carole Lymburn by saying, "She has received a letter from us asking her to keep to herself." My mother has received no such letter. Please explain this statement? You also said, "The building inspector went out there last week and he was quite happy." I am bringing to your attention that these new tenants you have chosen to live next to my mother need to take instruction on how to reside in a Suburban environment. Please advise them that it is your organisation who is responsible to see that Corporation tenants have the right to experience the quiet enjoyment of their home.

This means that they must not deliberately cause disturbance to neighbours by banging furniture around the bare floorboards for hours. (Where did all the carpet disappear to?)

Also it is illegal to drive a vehicle off the road without a driveway, especially when it involves digging up all the grass verge and parking a car alongside the front fence covering the footpath stopping pedestrians from having access and forcing them into the mud.

Perhaps Ms Hill you may care to write to Ms Aner Lorraine BROWN at 81 Moa Road and ask her to "Keep to herself" you may also like to inform your tenant and her associate Gary Chatterton the convicted drug criminal, that I am not sexually involved with my own mother and I do not have the Aids Virus and I have not given Aids to anyone least of all my mother. They have accused me of these things publicly on the street. No wonder you refuse to discuss the matter when you defend these people

I know Ms Brown attends the drug dependency clinic at 323 Great North Road, I saw her leaving the building with my own eyes on 31st May 1992. I have discussed this matter with Ms Warren at the centre.

I know she associates with Gary Chatterton a convicted drug addict and dealer and a violent criminal, he is awaiting trial on a very violent assault.
My mother's previous neighbour Ms Kaka associated with Chatterton as well. These women brought him in to terrorise us.

I also know you granted Ms Brown the tenancy but it does not give you the right to approve of their vicious behaviour towards us both.

- eg. - Ms Brown spitting over my mother on the street saying "I hope you get Aids" and "I wish you would die you fucking old bitch."
- assaulting me on the street using three others to pull my hair, punch my face and bash me down on the pavement injuring my right arm to the extent I had to seek medical help and have physiotherapy to alleviate the pain.
- banging on my mother's back door threatening my life and that of my mother's and violently screaming "you slut you prostitute you whore" and "last night five men came around here and raped you." This was Chatterton and Brown and Brown smashed my \$250 glasses out on the street.

As for MS Kakas;

She has been responsible for extremely vicious public attacks on my mother's good character and you have also been a party to her slander by saying to your staff my mother is mentally, and when you were challenged you covered by saying "they are MS KAKAS words."

you may be able Ms Hill, to comfortably identify with all these types of people, but my mother has taught me higher standards and if defending our decent living is "always complaining" as you said to me today, then we will never be ashamed of that criticism.

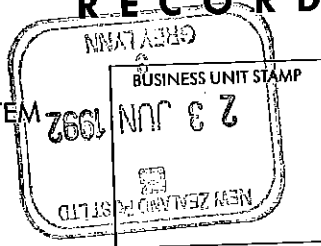

I spoke to you about two weeks ago regarding a woman on your drug programme.

On 31st May 1992 I saw a woman leaving your clinic in the company of two children and two dogs.

I recognised her to be the woman who on 5th November 1991, in the company of three other people, assaulted me on the street outside my mothers house, pulling my hair, punching my face, and bashing me down on the concrete, injuring my right arm. I had to have medical treatment and physiotherapy for the damage to my elbow. She took my glasses valued at \$250 and would not return them.

On 6th November 1991 she returned to my mothers house in the company of Gary Chatterton, a drug criminal. My mother was alone and he threatened her and was going to kill us. He said to my mother, "you slut, you prostitute, you whore," and "Last night five men came around here and raped you." He was crazed and smashed all ~~her~~ potted plants. The woman held my glasses up to my mother

at her window and said "Come out and get them or I'll smash them."

My ~~my~~ mother was afraid to go out to get my glasses so the woman smashed them at the front gate. My mother found a piece of the lens and my optician tested it. He confirms it was from my glasses.

I believe I have now identified this woman to be Aner Lorraine BROWN and she has spent many months tormenting and terrorising my mother.

On 30th October 1991 she approached my mother on the street and blocked her way. She criticised her, abused her, and threatened her. She then spat over my mother's clothes saying "I hope you catch aids" and "I wish you would die, you fucking old bitch." She used filth and abuse at my mother all the way down the street to my mother's gate.

I bring it to your attention that this woman is dangerous and very violent and my mother had to make two complaints to the Police about her child using filth and obscene talk to her at her front gate. (Complaints made to Constable Grant on 8/6/92 and Sgt Mitchell on 10/6/92, both at the Central Police Station)

you inferred you would, with the assistance of other areas e.g. Social Welfare, deal with this

matter.

have done to control your patient
and ensure my future safety

In conjunction with my phone conversation yesterday to you I have enclosed a copy of a letter I have dispatched by registered mail, to Miss Hill.

Miss Hill is responsible for placing tenants, and she has deliberately put a whole family in a one bedroom flat. They clearly have not been accommodated fairly because they obviously need more than one bedroom and also off street parking for their two vehicles.

With changes taking place and all the thousands of people requiring single bedroom accommodation Miss Hill had to put these people in the next door flat. Why could she not find a single quiet living person.

She has purposely done this to my mother because she is in the position to do so.

I do not have any faith that I will get an honest reply and this is your opportunity to monitor her actions when she receives my letter.

The letter to Miss Hill contains a small sample of the vicious attacks made on us by these people.

One of the cruelest things they have done to my mother was to ring her impersonating the Accident Dept of the Hospital and saying "Your Son has been involved in an accident."

It took several hours to establish that I and my two brothers were safe. This put my mother into a very distressed state and she was upset for days. (8th Dec 1991)

On another occasion when my mother was awaiting news from the United States on the condition of her dying sister, they phoned her and warned her to keep her door locked, "They were going to get her!" My mother received a death call within days and this indicates the vile types of people Miss Hill supports. (13th February 1991)

What are we to do, when Miss Hill is intent on persecuting us and using her position to do so.

If she had spoken to Ms Brown or Mr Chatterton the way she spoke to me she would have had her face punched in. She picks her victims.

It is people exactly like Ms O'Neill who protect these criminals.

I am very determined to obtain justice in spite of Ms O'Neill.

Ms O'Neill has got a real nerve telling my mother to ignore it.

This aggravation has gone on too long and that advice has worn very thin.

I do not know what Mrs O'Neill's background is and she was not available at 3-45pm today when I called to interview her but I am sure that if the abuse and filthy gestures were directed at her all the time without provocation she would expect to be fairly treated too.

On 7th June 1992 when this child viciously abused my mother he came running down the road to her gate when he saw her come out to put out her rubbish bag.

The next time he followed my mother along the road on his bike to yell and scream at her.

This child has a filthy mouth and mind. He needs to be told it is socially unacceptable to tell elderly women to "fuck themselves" and "take his cock and pull it" and make obscene gestures pointing to his genitals and bend over pulling down his pants making disgusting actions, exposing his rectum.

I will not have my mother subjected to this treatment just because Ms O'Neill says she has to. She has a real cheek to ask people to suffer this treatment when she would not herself.

It is very easy to say it is my mother's fault.

It is people like Ms O'Neill who sit with a blank expression on her face and say she doesn't know what is wrong with society when women are brutally attacked and elderly women are raped and murdered in their own homes. When violence strikes her family tell her she should have done something to stop it. She can start with Nathan Adams.

If you cannot offer a more satisfactory solution to them leaving my mother alone, to live in peace, then I will have to take this matter further.



I spoke to you about two weeks ago regarding a woman on your drug programme.

On 31st May 1992 I saw a woman leaving your clinic in the company of two children and two dogs.

I recognised her to be the woman who on 5th November 1991, in the company of three other people, assaulted me on the street outside my mothers house, pulling my hair, punching my face, and bashing me down on the concrete, injuring my right arm. I had to have medical treatment and physiotherapy for the damage to my elbow. She took my glasses valued at \$250 and would not return them.

On 6th November 1991 she returned to my mothers house in the company of Gary Chatterton, a drug criminal. My mother was alone and he threatened her and was going to kill us. He said to my mother, "You slut, you prostitute, you whore" and "Last night five men came around here and raped you." He was crazed and smashed all ~~her~~ potted plants. The woman held my glasses up to my mother

at her window and said "Come out and get them or I'll Smash-them!"

My ~~my~~ mother was afraid to go out to get my glasses so the woman Smashed them at the front gate. My mother found a piece of the lens and my optician tested it. He confirms it was from my glasses.

I believe I have now identified this woman to be Aner Lorraine BROWN and she has spent many months tormenting and terrorising my mother.

On 30th October 1991 she approached my mother on the street and blocked her way. She criticised her, abused her, and threatened her. She then spat over my mothers clothes saying "I hope you catch aids" and "I wish you would die, you fucking old bitch." She used filth and abuse at my mother all the way down the street to my mothers gate.

I bring it to your attention that this woman is dangerous and very violent and my mother had to make two complaints to the Police about her child using filth and obscene talk to her at her front gate. (Complaints made to Constable Grant on 8/6/92 and Sgt Mitchell on 10/6/92, both at the Central Police Station)

you inferred you would, with the assistance of other areas e.g. Social Welfare, deal with this

matter.

Extra 6 months added to two-year term

19 OCT 1989 HERALD

A Mt Roskill man who was sentenced last week to two years in prison on drugs charges had another six months added to his jail term yesterday.

Gary Russell Chatterton, aged 37, a secondhand furniture dealer, appeared in the Auckland District Court for sentencing on charges of using cocaine, possessing temgesic tablets, possessing cannabis and allowing his house to be used for a drug offence.

He was also sentenced on three assault charges, two counts of failing to answer bail and one charge of possessing an offensive weapon, namely a baseball bat.

Counsel for Chatterton, Mr David McNaughton, asked Judge P. J. Duncan to sentence his client to con-

current jail terms on the charges because he was already serving a two-year prison sentence following convictions for possessing heroin and possessing morphine for supply.

The drugs charges arose after police raided Chatterton's home in the early hours of May 27.

Two plastic bags containing cannabis and 27 temgesic tablets were found in a bedroom.

Three needles and syringes and pieces of paper showing a residue lay on a table in the lounge.

Chatterton said he and two friends had been injecting themselves with cocaine earlier in the night.

Mr McNaughton said Chatterton — who pleaded guilty to all of the charges — had been a drug addict for 15 years.

He had assaulted a man who had intervened during a violent argument with his wife and, on another occasion, two youths who he believed had interfered with his car.

Judge Duncan sentenced Chatterton to prison for 12 months for allowing his home to be used for the drug offences, three months for using cocaine and two months for each charge of possessing temgesic tablets and cannabis.

The sentences were to be served concurrently with the two-year term imposed by the High Court at Auckland last week.

Concurrent jail terms of six months for each of the assault and offensive weapon charges and six weeks for the failing to answer bail charges were ordered by Judge Duncan to be served cumulatively with the two-year sentence.

Heroin accused 30 JUN 1989 HERALD fails to appear

A warrant has been issued for a Sandringham man charged with possessing heroin for supply, who failed to appear in the Auckland District Court yesterday.

Gary Russell Chatterton, a 37-year-old secondhand dealer, was charged with possessing heroin (a Class A drug) for supply on April 27.

He was also jointly charged, with an unemployed Stillwater woman, Diane Elizabeth Sheen, 28, of possessing morphine, a Class B drug, for supply.

Sheen, who did appear before Judge C. J. Rushton, faced an additional charge of selling morphine.

She was remanded on bail for a depositions hearing on August 22.

Drug binge ends in prison

4 OCT 1969
A Mt Roskill man who had been "bingeing" on drugs when police raided his house has been sent to prison for two years.

Gary Russell Chatterton, aged 37, a secondhand furniture dealer, appeared for sentence in the High Court at Auckland yesterday after pleading guilty to charges of possessing heroin, and possessing morphine for supply.

Mr Justice Robertson said that Chatterton's life had been bedevilled by drug abuse, yet he allowed himself to become a link in the network which supplied misery to other addicts.

"I have no doubt that the court must mark society's absolute condemnation of any who feed the habit in others," Mr Justice Robertson said.

"You are probably the classic example of what drugs do to people. For about 12 years drugs have dominated you. . ."

Chatterton was sentenced to two years' jail on the morphine charge, and a concurrent term of three months for possessing heroin.

The sentence took into account the four months the defendant had already spent in prison on remand.

Mr David McNaughton, defence counsel, submitted that Chatterton had been on a two-week drug "binge" when police searched his home.

Mr McNaughton said that the drug binge followed the breakdown of the defendant's marriage, and came after almost two years on a methadone maintenance programme.

It was while in such a vulnerable state that Chatterton became involved in a scheme to distribute morphine which had been brought to Auckland from Gisborne by a woman friend.


Thank you for writing to me with your complaints about the Housing Corporation in Auckland and the difficulties your mother has experienced with her neighbours.

You have made some very serious allegations about Corporation staff in your letter to me. I am assured by the Corporation that its staff have certainly not made threatening telephone calls to your mother. I am sorry if your mother is getting such calls and I would suggest that if it happens again you should contact the Police. Telecom technology allows such calls to be traced.

I have read of the difficulties that occurred between Ms Kaka and yourself. I understand that Ms Kaka has now moved from your neighbourhood but that you are experiencing similar difficulties with your new neighbour, Mr Tito. It seems to me that some of your complaints are quite reasonable, but I understand that your neighbours have also complained to the Corporation about yourself and your mother. You must understand that it is very difficult to know who to believe. It does appear, however, that there are problems on both sides. I am advised that both Mr Tito and your mother have been advised of their obligations to each other and to the Corporation, under the Residential Tenancies Act 1986. I believe that it is important that you do try to get along with your neighbours and that they, in turn, treat you with respect. A further mediation may be worth considering.

The only other alternative, I'm afraid, is for your mother to consider moving to another tenancy. I realise that you consider this to be unfair, but it may be the best solution. She is obviously very unhappy living in Moa Road. If you would like to discuss this matter, then I would invite you to contact your local Housing New Zealand neighbourhood unit. Staff members will be pleased to assist you.

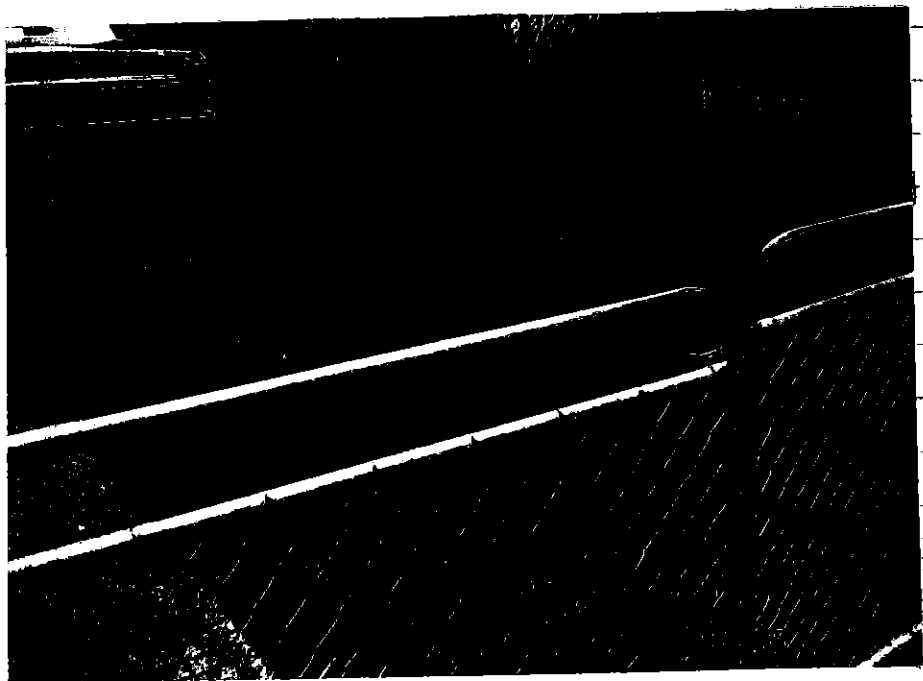


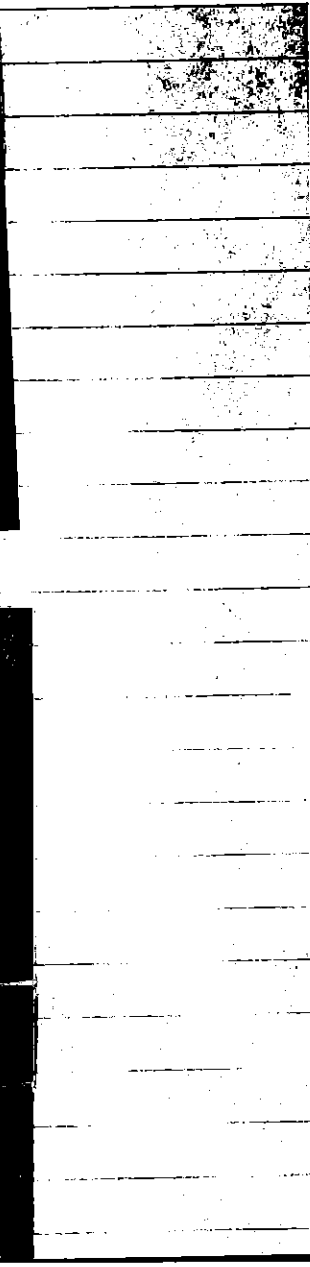
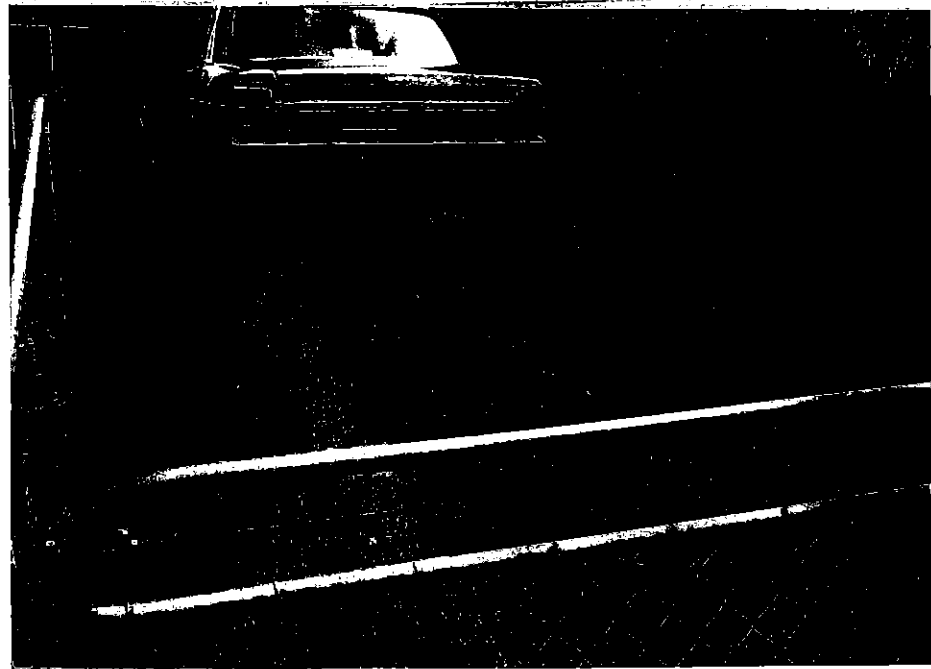

I have personally looked into the concerns that Mr Lymburn has raised with the Minister about his mother's tenancy. My conclusion is that Mrs Lymburn is not a suitable tenant, and that we should end her tenancy.

Our file is testimony to the fact that for a long time many experienced and capable officers have borne the brunt of a continual stream of complaints and abuse from Mrs Lymburn and her son. The efforts that have been made to resolve apparent difficulties are documented in the attached file notes, which I recommend you take the time to read. To summarise them could not convey the genuine efforts made, or frustrations felt by staff.

The option of having an independent party assess the situation in order to provide an impartial report was considered but not pursued. There would be nothing gained unless Mrs Lymburn was to accept the findings without question, and in any case I considered the weight of evidence on our files did not justify the expense that would be incurred.

My recommendation is that the Minister continue with the line that he took in his letter of 17 August.

From our perspective, her behaviour is unacceptable and she is clearly unhappy in her unit, and it is our intention to issue her with three months notice of termination of the tenancy.

This will not be well received, and we will need to prepare for the onslaught that is almost certain to occur. However, enough is enough, and the time has come for the situation to be brought to a conclusion.

On Thursday 5th November 1992 my mother Carole Lymburn arrived home to find her neighbour Mr Tito had intruded to her part of the rental property by digging up her lawn and topping her flowering plants. He was sitting on his verandah waiting as my mother walked in her gate.

She asked him why he had done such a thing.

He said that he was taking over the whole front of the property including her side.

He ordered her to get out of his country and said to get overseas that she was on his land.

He also said that he was "taking my mother to court" that a woman from Housing NZ had been out to the property and she had given him authority to do what he liked with the garden, including my mother's side of the area which has been bordered for all time, by my mothers

pathway.

My mother went inside and phoned Housing New Zealand.

A woman discussed the matter and said yes she had been out to the property, but no, had not given permission for him to take control.

She emphasized that my mother was on a 'cheap' rent and more or less should have no rights. When my mother asked her name she hung the phone up.

I have been mowing the area of lawn in question for 12 years.

Mr Tito is not going to 'push' my mother around.

When are your tenants, and your staff, going to leave my mother alone?

The very next day your tenant at 81 called my mother a "fucking old bitch" as she walked home, and she continues to behave viciously towards my mother every time she sees her.

What is the position, and when is your "Chief Executive" going to interview us so we can present our evidence?

We are not troublemakers merely protecting our rights as human beings, and so far our rights have been taken off us.


Thank you for writing to me with your complaints about the Housing Corporation in Auckland and the difficulties your mother has experienced with her neighbours.

You have made some very serious allegations about Corporation staff in your letter to me. I am assured by the Corporation that its staff have certainly not made threatening telephone calls to your mother. I am sorry if your mother is getting such calls and I would suggest that if it happens again you should contact the Police. Telecom technology allows such calls to be traced.

I have read of the difficulties that occurred between Ms Kaka and yourself. I understand that Ms Kaka has now moved from your neighbourhood but that you are experiencing similar difficulties with your new neighbour, Mr Tito. It seems to me that some of your complaints are quite reasonable, but I understand that your neighbours have also complained to the Corporation about yourself and your mother. You must understand that it is very difficult to know who to believe. It does appear, however, that there are problems on both sides. I am advised that both Mr Tito and your mother have been advised of their obligations to each other and to the Corporation, under the Residential Tenancies Act 1986. I believe that it is important that you do try to get along with your neighbours and that they, in turn, treat you with respect. A further mediation may be worth considering.

The only other alternative, I'm afraid, is for your mother to consider moving to another tenancy. I realise that you consider this to be unfair, but it may be the best solution. She is obviously very unhappy living in Moa Road. If you would like to discuss this matter, then I would invite you to contact your local Housing New Zealand neighbourhood unit. Staff members will be pleased to assist you.

We have suffered grave injustices and have been victims of Police Slander who have allowed drug criminals to threaten us viciously, including an incident of assault where three Police Stations and Six Police officers refused to record my complaint and were intent on protecting convicted drug addicts and dealers.

Subject Ministerial 134/92 - Anthony Lymburn

Anthony Lymburn is the son of our tenant Mrs C Lymburn, who lives at 82 Moa Road, Point Chevalier. A recent Ministerial (125/92) covered similar ground. Our report on that was sent 11 November.

This latest complaint relates to the land around the double unit. I have enclosed photos and a sketch (not to scale) in which I have attempted to show the situation.

I have personally interviewed Mr Tito (tenant of the front unit) and am satisfied that his intentions are no more than to bring some colour and life to the front of his unit. To this end he had dug over some of the lawn, and was making preparations to plant. Mrs Lymburn took exception to what he had done, and trampled on the dug over area nearest her access path. As a result, Mr Tito has decided not to proceed with his plans.

It seems clear to me that given normal relationships, the two parties would have been talking to each other and this situation would not have arisen. However, from reading the papers supplied with the 11 November report you will agree that this is not a normal situation.

The complaints about neighbours and staff have a familiar ring, and have been well covered previously. I understand from Mr Tito that a petition has been circulating the neighbourhood about the attitude of Mrs Lymburn towards other residents. It is to be presented to the local Community Constable who has apparently been told not to follow up the continual stream of complaints he receives about and from Mrs Lymburn.

How the Minister replies to Mr Lymburn is dependent to some degree on his response to the earlier representations. However, I would suggest that he could clarify that the land in front of Mr Tito's unit, defined as being the area to the immediate ~~left~~ of Mrs Lymburn's access path, is his responsibility.
